

RED-TAILED HAWK

Red-tailed hawks have rounded wings for soaring on warm columns of air called **thermals**.

These hawks are 'sit and wait' predators; perching high before pouncing on prey. They can fly **20-40 mph** and dive up to **120 mph!**

They have excellent eyesight and can spot a mouse from **100 ft** away.



They are active during the daytime, making them **diurnal**.



Red-tailed hawk calls are frequently used to represent birds of prey in films, especially Bald Eagles.



Nest type



They build stick nests with clutches of 4-7 eggs.

Diet



These hawks are not picky. Small and large mammals, amphibians, reptiles, birds and carrion are on the menu!

Habitat



They are widespread. Living in open country, deserts, grasslands, woodlands, scrublands, fields and even tropical rainforests in Mexico.
